# MEET INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT JASON STOWE

Kingsley Schools' Board of Education accepted the resignation of former superintendent Dr. Keith Smith on September 12. Jason Stowe will serve the district until Christmas Break on December 21.

"My goal for these first few weeks is to meet with as many people as possible. I think part of my job right now is to listen and to find out what has gone really well over the last decade, and what needs some improvement. When the district does hire a permanent superintendent, it will be really important that the district has a good, clear plan."



On Wednesday, September 21, longtime Northern Michigan educator Jason Stowe started work as the interim superintendent of Kingsley Schools following the resignation of Dr. Keith Smith.

The Northport native joins the district with extensive experience working in northwestern Michigan schools, including nine years as superintendent of Leland Schools, and most recently, as interim superintendent at Glen Lake Schools in 2021.

Reflecting on his first few days on the job in Kingsley, he called the district and the people who work for it "incredible."

"I've just been really impressed by the quality of people inside the schools. There's this caring, loving, nurturing environment. It doesn't take long to realize that all these people are here for the right reason."

As he helps the district navigate a new chapter, he says his goal is to open up a dialogue with the staff and community members.

"Of course, growing up in Northern Michigan, I've known about Kingsley my whole life. I understand small communities, and the school is a vital part of a community like Kingsley. My job is to be a representative of the school, and I'm here to have their best interests at heart," he said.

"My favorite part of working in education is the fact that you're just around people that have one focus, and that is the kids. The thing I love most about working in small schools is that as the superintendent, you get to walk into the buildings, right across the parking lot, to be reminded of what it is we're doing here. You're always around great people, and you're making a difference."

Have you heard? Kingsley Area Schools is offering FREE breakfast to all students through December 2022! In addition, this year only we are paying for all reduced meal prices.

What does this mean for your family? Breakfast will be **FREE** for all students that decide to participate in the school meal program until Christmas Break.

Families that have qualified for reduced meals will not have to pay the reduced meals for the 2022-2023 school year.

To apply for Free or Reduced meals log onto Kingsley.familyportal.cloud.

You only need to apply one time per household per year.

You can submit a new application at any time there is an income change.

We are asking that you please complete and submit it as soon as possible to ensure that additional funding for our school is available to meet the needs of our students.

Meal Charging: Students are allowed to charge \$13.00 on their accounts. After \$13.00, students may receive an alternative lunch, and their account will still be charged for the school lunch. Students are not permitted to charge "extras." Extras would be items outside of reimbursable meal such as an individual milk, extra entrée, or ala carte items.




### A. Papano's student athletes of the week

August 29: Jen Lefler, Volleyball. Jen is a senior hitter on the Kingsley varsity volleyball team this fall. She had an excellent opening quad on August 24, showing outstanding leadership with 24 kills, 44 digs, and a perfect 30 for 30 serving. She carries a 3.7 GPA.



September 12: Grace Lewis, Volleyball. Grace is a junior hitter who had an outstanding tournament at TC Central, leading the Stags with 33 kills, 47 digs, and seven aces. Grace also excels in basketball and softball while carrying a perfect 4.0 grade point average, ranking #1 in the junior class.
