## MIDDLE, HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS EXPERIENCE CHALLENGE DAY



"It's hard to truly come up with words to describe the experience."

In February, hundreds of middle and high school students participated in <u>Challenge Day</u>, an extensive workshop focused on building a school culture of acceptance, empathy, and connection. Students were asked to be brave by being vulnerable and willing to share their stories and listen to others.

"I have participated in several Challenge Days throughout my career and not one Challenge Day is the same. However, it never fails to make a positive impact on many of those in the room," said middle school counselor Olivia Bradford. "I could feel the passion in the students who truly want positive change throughout our district and community. This experience was unlike any other."

Challenge Day is an acclaimed workshop that has served thousands of schools and millions of students in the US and abroad. An impact survey on their website says 76% of students reported feeling "less lonely after participating" and 63% felt "better connected" to peers and adults.

"I think the experience showed the students that they are more alike than they are different," said KHS assistant principal Cody Wagatha.

# MASB Presents Strategic Plan Results to School Board



After months of community input sessions, planning retreats, and internal meetings, the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) presented results from the district's Strategic Planning process to the school board on February 12.

The process, launched in October 2023, aimed to gather stakeholder feedback to inform and align the district's goals, mission statement, and areas of improvement.

More than 400 community members responded to the online Strategic Plan survey, and 29 dedicated participants contributed to in-person discussions and meetings.

Penny McWilliams from the MASB identified focus areas and drafted a mission statement and district vision.

The five focus areas are:
Academics & Programs, Learning
Environment & Culture,
Communications & Community
Engagement, Operations &
Finance, and Personnel.

The Board decided to review her final report and will vote on its approval at the March board meeting. Stay tuned for more updates regarding next steps and implementation.

#### 2024-25 Preschool



#### GSRP: Free State Funded Preschool

To apply for a GSRP slot parents will need to email Kristin Goethals at kgoethals@kingsleyschools.org or go to NMCAA.net to set up an appointment and indicate Kingsley Preschool Program as their first choice of schools. The appointments are done in collaboration with NMCAA for Kingsley GSRP and Hannah Headstart slots. The GSRP slots are for students who are four years old by September 1° 2024. GSRP slots will be offered to qualifying at risk families based on a series of risk factors including low family income. Families qualifying for GSRP after their appointment will be asked to designate a first choice and second choice of program locations. Students may also be offered a Hannah Headstart slot if they qualify. The state qualifies students through June and acceptance letters are mailed at that time. Hours of operation are 8:30-3:15 Monday through Thursday with the option to add a paid day on Friday. (Limited spots) ALL students who will be 4 need to complete this application due to the state language around possible universal preschool for next year.

#### **Tuition Preschool**

The tuition based program is open to any family whose child is 30 months of age up to school age, and is potty trained. There are no income qualifiers to be accepted into the program, and the cost is \$33 per day (for the 2023-24 year, **subject to change**). The \$33 per day includes lunch, a morning snack, and an afternoon snack. Program options include Tuesday/Thursday, Monday/Wednesday/Friday, or Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday/Friday. Space is limited. Filling out a preregistration form does **NOT** guarantee enrollment. Letters will be mailed in May verifying acceptance. Hours of operation are 7:45 am to 3:45 pm.
