KINGSLEY NJROTC CADETS EXCEL AT ARMY CHALLENGE CAMP

Kingsley cadets attended the JROTC Cadet Leadership Challenge at Fort Custer June 22-27. The kids hit the ground running on day one, waking up at 0430, and racking out 2000.

The Army threw a curve ball this year by splitting up the schools. There were 340 cadets training, and they were broken into companies.

Kingsley set the bar high at camp! I walked into a conversation the first night at chow (dinner) where one Army instructor asked the other,

""Why are all these Navy kids 'outstanding?! Every single one of them is a go getter, knows how to drill, knows their knowledge, why can't all of our kids be like that? And they are all first years with eighth graders? They are making us look bad!"

The commander in charge of Army JROTC in Michigan, Colonel Peters, invited us back next year saying "your cadets are so polite, professional, hardworking and encouraging, we want Kingsley back next year."

I received nonstop compliments and praise from the Army staff who were working the obstacles and events.

Several of our kids were put into the leadership roles at camp. Even some of our incoming ninth graders! And they stepped up immediately.

KAS Establishes Forestry Commission to Brainstorm Ways to Utilize School Land

Did you know? Kingsley Area Schools owns 815 acres of forested property, containing a multitude of natural features and wildlife species! KAS established a forestry commission in April. Their first task was to hire a forester to make an assessment, write a management plan, and provide ideas for use

The Forestry Commission hired Daniel Schillinger with Schillinger Forestry, LLC. Our next steps are to meet with the forester once initial field work is complete and discuss goals that would make sense for each property.

The diversity within and between the properties allow us to make goals that can provide a wide range of services to our students, including education, recreation, public use, and even research.

For example, the property on Sparling has the potential to create a cross country track or an obstacle course. Another example comes out of the 1998 Forest Management plan which talks about having a nature center on the property on Garfield road.

In fact, the high school's logging class completed a building that could be used as a nature center. The amazing biodiversity of the Garfield property creates a perfect space to host a nature center focused on student education.

We are excited to continue working on this!

Kingsley High School Alum Max Goethals Helps Team USA Win Gold at U19 Championship







The class of 2024's Max Goethals is doing big things!

This summer, he was selected to the U19 Men's National Rugby Team, and competed at the 2025 Americas North Championship in Querétaro, Mexico.

Max helped Team USA beat Jamaica 48-8 to win the championship.

Stateside, his family and friends gathered at Locals Lake Leelanau to watch the thrilling final match and cheer him on.

The tournament is the premier U19 rugby competition across North America and the Caribbean, and "offers young athletes the opportunity to compete in challenging rugby environments and represent their country on the international stage," according to a statement from USA Rugby.

It also plays a critical role in Team USA's long-term

strategy to elevate American rugby on the world stage.

Team USA's Moonshot 2031 initiative aims to develop homegrown talent and build a team capable of reaching the semifinals of the 2031 Rugby World Cup, which will be hosted in the United States for the first time.

Max earned his spot on the U19 team along with players from all over the country.

Max graduated Kingsley High School in 2024 after an illustrious career in academics and athletics.

He made the Top 10 list in his class for outstanding grades, good character, and leadership, and was named academic all-state in three sports, football, wrestling, and track & field. He also competed on the TC Alliance Rugby team.

In high school, he won a football and rugby state championship and competed at States for wrestling, too.



As we look forward to what I believe will be a fantastic year, I want to take a moment to reflect on some of our recent successes that we'll continue to build upon.

We've seen higher pass rates, fewer discipline issues, rising test score averages (PSAT/SAT), the exciting addition of NJROTC, improved curriculums, ongoing achievements in fine arts and athletics, and more opportunities for our students through programs like NJROTC, scientific research, and our move to the Northern Shores Conference with events like Leadership Day, Art Day, Honor Band, and the Academic All Conference Ceremony.

All of this progress really speaks to the strong support of our families, the dedication of our students, and the hard work of our staff.

Looking ahead to this school year at KHS, we're excited to roll out a positive behavior intervention program.

We'll also be launching new Algebra and Spanish curriculums to better align with our middle school, continuing our after-school tutoring and math interventions, and maintaining SAT prep.

Minimizing distractions during class will also be a priority to keep everyone engaged.

There's also ongoing discussion about a possible statewide decision on personal devices. At KHS, students have access to a free schoolissued Chromebook or can bring their own laptop. Because of this, cell phones, smartwatches, earbuds, and other personal devices are not allowed during class times whether in classrooms, hallways, the library, commons, or any other area. Our policy remains the same as over the past three years, resetting each semester:

- -If a device is used inappropriately, it will be taken to the office and can be picked up at the end of the day by the student.
- -Further inappropriate use results in a parent or guardian coming to retrieve the device.
- -If necessary, a device may not be permitted in the building for the rest of the semester.

We're just a few short weeks away from when our building will be bustling with students and staff again. Keep an eye out for upcoming messages about the 9th grade/new to KHS orientation, Chromebook contracts and pickup, Project Graduation 2026 and senior parking lot painting. We're also excited to invite you to our District Open House on Tuesday, August 26th, from 5:30 to 7:00PM.
