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STATE CHAMPS! STAGS WIN DIVISION 6 TITLE IN 38-24 GAME VERSUS ALMONT



For the second time in school history, the Kingsley Stags are State Champions in football after a thrilling win against Almont at Ford Field. "A record-tying performance from [senior running back] Eli Graves helped secure a victory...he accounted for three touchdowns in the first half alone, also tying the state finals record by being responsible for 30 points," reported Kameron Goodwill for *The Detroit News*. Chase Bott also added a 35-yard touchdown thanks to a pass from QB Gavyn Merchant.


To players and coaching staff, this game was about more than just bringing home the hardware. Graves told reporters he dedicated his game to his brother Owen, whose senior season was cut short by the pandemic. In post-game interviews, Coach Tim Wooer mentioned former captain Justin Hansen, a Marine killed in combat in Afghanistan, and Trina Schueller, a longtime football mom who died from COVID in 2021. "There comes a time where your players teach you about life, and Justin Hansen did that for sure, and so did Connor Schueller. In October, the Kingsley Area Schools Board of Education and the Administration launched a new initiative to guide them through a three- to five-year Strategic Plan.

The process included community and staff input events, data collection, and other efforts to create a shared vision and goals for the future of the district and strategies to achieve them, all while using scarce public education resources in the most effective and efficient way.

Focus groups with stakeholders have now concluded and the online community survey has now closed.

On December 9, the Board of Education will host a workshop with the Michigan Association of School Boards from 8:00AM-4:00PM at the KHS Library.

The board and the MASB expect to begin implementing some of the new strategic plans in January 2024.
