Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-2025 educational progress for Kingsley High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Christopher Rapes for assistance.

For the 2024-2025 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2024-2025. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2024-2025. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2024-2025. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not identified as requiring a label. Kingsley High School continues to work hard to improve the rigor in the courses of study that we offer all of our students. Increased student achievement, and removing gaps in achievement remain focal points of our pursuit of student success.

- Tutoring - free after-school tutoring is offered 4 days a week at the high school level and is supported by certified teaching staff.
- Social/Emotional Wellness - Mental health continues to be at the forefront of keeping our kids, or schools, and our communities safe. Social emotional lessons, surveys, and QR codes throughout the building to encourage students to discreetly contact building counselors and administration if a crisis arises. Local agencies such as K-Town and support from the FAST team through Northern Lakes Community Mental Health ensure swift and appropriate action to support our kids. Additional signage was placed throughout the building to provide numbers of services that students can readily access if needed. KHS introduced a behavioral specialist to identify at-risk groups to work with to support their needs.
- Interventions in Math and English were implemented and are part of the school day. This intervention is on a rotating schedule and implemented by KHS teachers.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

- Kingsley High School meets annually to review district MICIP data. This data is based on information provided by Northwest Ed , anecdotal records, and perception data collected during the school year. This process is ongoing to ensure continued progress toward the success of all of our students.
- Kingsley High School is in full compliance with the Michigan Department of Education school improvement plan model and the Michigan Merit Curriculum to develop and implement the school improvement plan. This model is provided through AdvanceEd, an online tool that allows schools to develop goals and strategies to address areas that are in need of enhancement or improvement. Kingsley High School currently has four school improvement goals that are focused on the improvement of student achievement in the areas of math, science, social studies, and language arts. Kingsley High School curriculum can be viewed by inquiring at the high school office.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

- Parent-Teacher conferences within KHS Tuesday October 14th and Wednesday October 15th. During this time, 64 students were represented by their parents/guardians during those days. This represents approximately 16% attendance. Conference attendance improvement was associated with moving conferences midway through the first marking period rather than after the marking period was complete and grades being stored.



- Kingsley High School offered one Advanced Placement course for the 2024-2025 school year; AP Literature and Composition.
- Advanced Placement participation at Kingsley High School is approximately 1.25% of the total student population. During the 2024-2025 school year, 5 KHS students took an AP exam.
- Five (5) KHS students enrolled in AP classes during the 2024-2025 school year earned scores that qualified for post-secondary credit with a score of 3 or higher. The mean AP Literature and Composition score was 3.60.
