## CKLA SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE

#### Skills Unit 1:

Students practiced reading, spelling, and writing words with a the inflectional endings – s and –es. When a noun is plural or more than one then you use an –es if it ends in the sounds sh, ch, x, s, or z. When a verb ends in one of these sounds as well you use an –es ending.

<u>Ask your child</u>: To write and read the following words...

 buses, dishes, boxes, foxes, presses, lunches, wishes, bunches, buzzes

## Knowledge Domain 2: Early Asian Civilizations

- This week students reviewed characteristics of ancient Indian civilizations.
- They learned that religion was a key characteristic to the formation of civilizations in ancient India and is the third most practiced religion to this day—— Hinduism.
- Students listened to a fictional trickster tale--The Tiger, the Bramen, and the Jackal
  - **Ask them** to retell the story using the setting, plot, and characters to help them.

Ask your child: What is the most interesting thing they have learned so far about civilizations in Ancient India?

#### **MATH**

# Unit 1: Addition and Subtraction within 20

- Students practiced **compare word problems.** This is when a story problem
  has two characters and you compare
  which has more or fewer, or how many
  more/fewer of the same object. These
  are very tricky! They will continue to
  practice these kinds of word problems.
- Ask your child to
  - o count by 2s, 5s, and 10s as high as they can go!
  - Say their doubles equations (1+1, 2+2, 3+3, 4+4 etc...)

### SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES

#### How are communities different?

Students reviewed **rural**, **suburban**, and **urban** communities and took a test on these types of communities.

 Ask your child: to draw you what a rural, suburban, and an urban community can look like. How do they know which community is which?
