



KINGSLEY AREA SCHOOLS CONTINUITY OF LEARNING PLAN 2022/23 SCHOOL YEAR

PLAN OUTLINE

Kingsley Area Schools is planning on in person traditional format for instruction for the 2022-23 school year. If there is a state required shut down, or the conditions in our area necessitate a shutdown, we will evaluate and plan accordingly for supporting Kingsley students.

GOALS

The plan was built around the following goals:

- Maintain face to face instruction for our schools to promote in person traditional learning
- Support our students to mitigate learning loss that occurred due to COVID
- The plan will keep Kingsley Students connected to Kingsley Teachers
- High academic standards

CURRENT MODEL

TRADITIONAL LEARNING:

Learning for students will take place in the school building.

- Students will eat lunch in the cafeteria.
- Students and Staff may wear masks if they choose.
- Cleaning will take place throughout the school day
- Hand sanitizing will take place throughout the school day.
- Sneezing and coughing into the elbow will be taught and reminded to students.
- Athletics will follow MHSAA guidelines.
- Parents will monitor students for symptoms of COVID.

ONLINE LEARNING

At this time online learning is not offered. If there is a state required shut down, or the conditions in our area necessitate a shutdown, Kingsley Area Schools will provide remote instruction for all students.

REMOTE LEARNING:

Students will be enrolled in an online option to access their instruction. The students will utilize the google classroom to access links, work, and other information provided by their Kingsley Area Schools teacher.

- Live Instruction recorded for students will be provided for core subject areas per building. The live instruction will be recorded and posted in the google classroom.
- Transition to traditional learning and vice versa will be coordinated with the building principal.
- Devices will be provided to all students who need one.
- Students without a device/internet will receive a weekly instructional packet to complete and submit to the school.
- Students/Staff will be required to make weekly contact. (email, phone, online platform, etc are all acceptable forms of communication)
- Students with technology access will access instruction through the Google classroom and then directed to links, work, or other sites.
- Concepts, Video Instruction and/or Assignments and will be posted by 8 am with clear due dates
- Classes or concepts will be recorded and posted the following morning for students
- Limited specials and electives will be available
- Teachers will provide office hours at least twice per week.
- Families will receive communication via email and phone calls through the allcall system.
- Website will have links to support documents
- Tech support email available

Additional Information

We recognize that there are many things that occur in the educational setting in addition to learning. We will do our best to keep families informed as things change or as more information becomes available.

Reconfirmation of this plan is required for schools receiving ARP ESSER funds. The District utilizes ARP ESSER funding to offsets costs for custodial services to maintain safe buildings, substitute teachers to promote healthy habits of staff and remove barriers for coverage for illness, educational materials to promote mental health and awareness, and activities addressing learning loss among Kingsley students.

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS TO MONITOR STUDENTS

Parent Monitoring Questions for Students

In the last 24 hours, has your child experienced a fever of over 100.4 degrees?

In the last 24 hours, has your child experienced a new or worsening cough?

In the last 24 hours, has your child experienced shortness of breath?

In the last 24 hours, has your child experienced a sore throat?

In the last 24 hours, has your child experienced diarrhea?

Has your child had close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19? Close contact means a household member, or someone within 6 feet for longer than 10 minutes?

Has your child been directed or told by the local health department or their healthcare provider to self-isolate or self-quarantine?

If you answered yes to any of the questions you should monitor your child for continuation of symptoms of COVID and follow your local health department or family physician's recommendations for testing.
